AMENDED AND RESTATED
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
FLORIDA ARTIST BLACKSMITH ASSOCIATION - CHAPTER OF
ASSOCIATION OF NORTH AMERICA, INC.

The Articles of Incorporation are amended and restated as follows:

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation is: Florida Artist Blacksmith Association, Inc.

ARTICLE II: REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office and mailing address of the corporation is Route 7 Box 1082 C, Tallahassee, FL 32308 (Sunrise Road, Leon County).

ARTICLE III: PURPOSES

- (1) The Florida Artist Blacksmith Association - Chapter of Artist Blacksmith Association of North America, Inc., hereafter called FABA, is a nonprofit educational institute which shall encourage and develop the art of blacksmithing, and shall educate members and the general public about blacksmithing and about activities, meetings, and opportunities for improving blacksmithing knowledge and skill.
- (2) FABA shall promote and preserve the art of blacksmithing through publications and through public meetings, demonstrations, exhibits, displays, lectures and other means.
- (3) FABA shall recognize individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the art of blacksmithing, and/or its preservation and promotion, by conferring upon them the honorary degree of Doctorate of Philosophy in the Art of Metalsmithing.

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS AND TRUSTEES

The corporation shall be governed by both Officers and Trustees. The number of officers and trustees, the method of their election and terms of office shall be as stated in the bylaws.

ARTICLE V: LIMITATION OF CORPORATE POWERS

- (1) The corporate powers of FABA are as specified in section 617.0302, Florida Statutes, or as that section may be subsequently renumbered, unless limited herein.
- (2) No part of the net earnings of FABA shall inure to the benefit or be distributed to its Members, Trustees, Officers, or other private persons, except that FABA

shall be authorized and empowered to make reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions to further the purposes set forth in these articles.

(3) No substantial part of the activities of FABA shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and FABA shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

(4) The purposes for which the corporation is organized are exclusively religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and educational within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

(5) Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this organization shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

ARTICLE VI: METHOD OF REMOVAL OF OFFICERS AND TRUSTEES

Any Officer or Trustee, whether elected or appointed, may be removed in the manner set out in the bylaws.

ARTICLE VII: POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The specific powers and duties of the members of the Board of Trustees shall be as provided by law and as otherwise stated in the bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII: MEMBERSHIP

(1) The qualifications for members and the manner of their admission shall be as established by the bylaws

(2) There shall be four classes of members--sponsoring business member, sponsoring family member, family member, and honorary life member--the description of which shall be contained in the bylaws.

(3) The membership of any sponsoring business member, sponsoring family or family member may be terminated by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members of the board of trustees.

ARTICLE IX: DURATION OF THE CORPORATION

The period of the duration of this corporation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law.

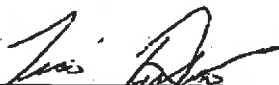
ARTICLE X: DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the organization will be turned over to one of more organizations, which themselves are exempt as organizations described in sections 501 (c)(3) and 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding sections of any prior or future Internal Revenue Code, or to the Federal, State, or local government for exclusive public purposes.

ARTICLE XI: REGISTERED AGENT

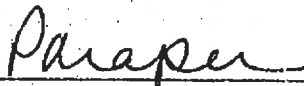
